

European Funds for Education at Skyport

(Prague, 5 April 2011) In March, Skyport a.s., a company operating a modern cargo terminal and providing handling services at Ruzyně Airport, launched an extensive professional training project for its employees. Funds for training and for increasing the competitiveness and adaptability of its employees came from the European Social Fund in the Czech Republic.
